	Nave and chancel are divided by a narrow pointed arch, which has a squint on each side, so small that they seem to have been intended for the use of one individual at a time. A chalice of the Elizabethan period has the usual inscription, but the name of the church is omitted, showing that these cups were kept in stock and when purchased the church name was inscribed. The font has a square top with cushion sides, supported by a circular pillar on a square base. The church (see Arch. Camb. IV, XIV, 339) is dedicated to St. Mary. It is called FROWLYN CHURCH in the Black Book of St. David's.
