In RWM i. 57 Llanwnda is given as the reading of the RB
History of Wales, 2nd Ed. 1912
version in Mostyn MS. 116, & Lloyd, HW i. 393 note 114 has relied
on this supposed variant to support Fenton's ~~claim~~ identification
of Pullgwadig with Goodwick in Pemb. But this variant reading
is not in Mostyn MS 116, which agrees with RB of Hengist
& Pen MS. 19 in reading Pull Gwdyc. Strangely enough, this
supposed variant is not given in the original MS. of RWM
(NLW Gwengwyn Evans MS. 59), so that it must have been
added in the proofs. Its provenance is a mystery.
