- This is noticed by Fenton (Pembrokeshire, p. 337). He calls the place Smurton. It is in a very strong position and shelves towards the north. It measures from north to south 107 yards, and from east to west 116 yards. The bank is about 20 feet high all round. There is an inner circle entirely surrounded by the outer with a varying space of about 20 yards between; the inner circle is 46 yards across and its bank is about 10 feet high.
