Ruins of Chapel 2639

The chapel is 49 feet long by 17 feet broad. The walls are about 12 feet in height. There are three doors and several windows; most of them small, can be traced; also a turret at south west with the remains of a staircase. It is attributed to Vaughan (Bishop 1509-23) and was unroofed soon after the Reformation. Browne Willis (Survey of St. Davids, p.54) knew "but few churches in Wales of a better kind of building with battlements round it and a tower at one end".
