Caerfarchell Moor Ancient Burial Ground 2677

In the south western corner of the field known as the "Cnwc" and in the public road leading to Caerfarchell, 40 years ago stone graves were seen, when Mr. Mortimer of Trewellwell employed men in enclosing a piece of the Common in order to make the "Cnwc" field more symmetrical. In the corner named they found stone graves and also an inscribed stone which Cornelius Protheroe, one of the workmen, says was placed with the inscribed face inwards, in the new portion of the hedge then built. There are several stones in the hedge large enough to be chosen as stones upon which to cut an inscription.
