St. Non's Chapel 2725-7

Ruins of St. Non's Chapel. See Jones & Freeman, pp. 226-227. George Owen en relative Browne Willis (p. 53) says the chapel was covered with a stone roof and enclosed by a wall with benches to sit on, round it. In the eastern wall there is a stone bearing an incised cross within a circle. Near the chapel is a covered well, to the water of which is attributed miraculous powers. Mr. Wm. Williams, of the Grove Hotel, informed the writer that he had seen an old man named Thomas Bowen bathing in the well, who claimed that the rheumatism from which he suffered had been cured. About 6 years ago a person living in Aberdare visited, and bathed in the well. John Evans of Tygwyn in 1825 cleaned out the well, and found coins lying on the bottom.
