Thomas Gwyther, the present occupier, says that he has heard the house was formerly four fronted, and that a bridge from an upper storey led into the garden. The front of the present house is built partly of dressed stone; portions of a still earlier building were taken down by a George Gwyther about 120 or 140 years ago. Some windows in the present house were closed to evade window tax and have not been re-opened. This house belonged to the Jones family, who were descended from William Johns, standard bearer of Henry VII. See Fenton, 142; Lewis Dwnn, Dale Castle and Llysnewydd MSS.
