One of the most important stone camps in the County of Pembroke.

On the north, south and west it is defended by the precipitous nature of the ground. Eastward is a double line of walling in which may be seen the remains of "sentry boxes". Some flanking walls run out, and, as usual in these camps, an out-work forms part of the scheme of defence. Ysgubor Gaer. The writer has found flint chips within the walls of Garn Fawr. That foundations are plentiful, but no sepulchral remains of either cairn or cromlech now exist.
