

Scarp edge? enclosure with wide spaced multivallion, outer enclosure (5) incomplete.

Visited by J. H. Williams, 10/5/1977.

The site is probably largely as described (1) as figured on the "OS 6", but was too overgrown for detailed inspection at the time of field observation. The inner enclosure being completely impenetrable. This inner enclosure was defended by a bank & ditch on the west & by a natural scarp on the east. The second bank runs north-west from the scarp edge on the south about 5M from the lip of the inner ditch, thus leaving a small interspace. There is no recognizable ditch. This bank was not traceable on the west in an area of impenetrable vegetation. The outer bank & ditch again runs NW from the scarp edge, & disappears abruptly on level ground as described. This appears to be an original feature.

The site is well preserved, & is located adjacent to the ~~at the~~ Tescos. Rhododendron vegetation occupies ~~such a~~ ~~possible~~ possible area for expansion between the present installation & the Haven.

To the west there is a curved bank 75 yards long by 20 feet high from bottom of outside ditch, which is 8 feet deep. Parallel to this is a bank 34 yards long, 15 feet high above bottom of ditch, which is 10 feet deep. The ditch is continued on for 100 yards towards the Haven, and has a second bank 20 feet high from bottom of ditch on its other side, where the ditch becomes a rough lane, and is bounded by a modern bank. On the other side the ditch disappears, but the bank is continued 85 yards.
