This gate was part of the mansion of the Paterchurch family; it passed afterwards by marriage to the Adamses, who disposed of it to Government when the dockyard was removed from Milford to this place. Oddly enough it was offered to the Hon. C.F. Greville at the time he was laying the foundations of Milford, and he seriously thought of purchasing. Had this transaction been completed, the dockyard would in all probability have remained at Milford. C.F.G. writing to the first Lady Cawdor 1.9.1802 "was surprised at the dilapidation; the house has neither roof, doors, or windows; the wind and thieves have been so diligent since my last visit that I do not know how my villa will become elegant". The idea of purchase was abandoned. Stackpole MSS; Fenton, 360.
