	The name is a duplicate, not uncommon in this district, of the Welsh LLETHER and the English HILL. Here was the house of the Haward, a cheshire family whose scion married the heiress of the Goddards. George Haward was Sheriff during the Protectorate. The family were liberal benefactors to Haverfordwest. From the ruins which are left, and from the site, it is evident that the house was of no great extent. At the end of the 18th century Flether Hill belonged Jure Uxoris to Sir Watkin Lewes, the Pembrokeshire Lord Mayor of London.
