The great cross of Margiteut at Carew so closely resembles that at

Nevern, and the one now placed in Golden Grove garden, that we are
led to the conclusion that all three were either carved by the
same man, or at all events by disciples of the same school. The
rendering of the inscription has varied greatly. Professor Rhys
and Mr. Romilly Allen are now agreed that the correct reading is

MARGITEUT RECETT F , i.e. "Meredith of Rheged made it" Arch. Camb.
V, xii, 187. Oddly enough inscriptions very closely resembling
this Carew legend have been found at Fethard and Bagibun in
