96 No. 1      North Hill, Lamphey      Village Cross      3511

In a rubbing-stone is embedded the shaft of Lamphey Cross, which formerly stood on the north side of the church, where the garden of the school house now is; the exact spot is marked by a Turkey Oak tree. The cross was destroyed about 1830 by the late Rev. J.B. Byers, because the village boys would sit on the steps instead of going to church. The debris was removed to the North Hill field by the late C. Mathias Esq.
