For the meaning of PILCORN see Owen's Pembrokeshire, I, 367. The camp is on ground sloping towards the south and then rapidly to the valley; all the banks have gone except on the north-east, where there are traces of a double bank. There is another camp in the field above Pilcornswell camp; it is not marked in the ordnance map. It is roughly circular, 104 yds in diameter; a hedge has been built right across the camp. The entrance is on the east. There is a gentle slope towards the west. The mound is apparent all round, but has suffered much from the plough.
