The chancel is divided from the nave by a stone screen, with two openings in the upper part, supported by two square stone pillars and one octagon. The chancel is divided from a little chapel on the north by an arcade, with a round stone pillar. There is another chapel on the south; also a door on that side (opposite the entrance which has been closed. Holy water stoup by door. The old font is adorned with four angels with a boss beneath each. The wall of the church under the tower is slightly recessed. The only monument in the church is to Thomas Davies, clerk, M.A., who died 19th August 1715. There is a small square tower on the west, entered from outside by a door about 24 feet from the ground, which was probably reached by a ladder; from this door three stone steps descend. There is a similar arrangement at East Williamston and at Begelly.
