Not very distinct, but seems to have been enclosed by a line of foss and vallum, which on the south side is coubled. A leading Welsh philologist has hinted that the rivers Cleddau took their name from the land through which they flow. He suggested that this land, having been conquered by a tribe, became the common property of that tribe, and was called by them Sword Land; then the rivers running through it were called Cleddau, or the SWORDS. If this guess is right, our camp may have been inhabited in the long ago by this military clan.
