Perhaps the most interesting of our Pembrokeshire castles. It has never been uninhabited, and though mutilated and restored, it still remains a castle. William de Picton, a follower of Arnulph de Montgomery, is said to have been the founder; but the building now existing seems rather to date from Edwardian times. See Fenton, 278.
