The walls are standing; the interior is so overgrown with brambles that it is difficult to investigate. There is a square tower on the west, with barrel-arched roof and steps to belfry. Pointed arch to chancel, which is lighted by a two-light square window. Some interesting windows remain. On the north of nave are two-light round arched windows. The stairs to the roof loft remain. Chapel in the south, with aumbrey; another aumbrey in the chancel. Monument outside wall of church to Isaac Llewellyn, who died 17th March 1832; also to John, his son, who died 8th April 1860. In the church: "Under this stone lies the body of John Barden / formerly steward to John Barlow, Esq. of Slebech / a trust which he discharged with such integrity and honour / that made him valued by his / master and esteemed by all honest men. He died February 21, 1749 / in the 63rd year of his age". Funerals have taken place here within living memory. The holy well was on the east of the churchyard.
