This little building had an endowment charged on the estate on which it stands. The payment was discontinued, and the chapel fell into ruin. Of late years the Bishop of Llandaff has restored the structure and enclosed it. There are no architectural details. Whether Mounton is the equivalent of Mountain - i.e. unenclosed land - or Monkton, the monks' hamlet, it is hard to say; but Monkton, the suburb of Pembroke, is always called Mounton by its old inhabitants.
