An interesting building. On the northern side is a large Lady chapel which is connected with the chancel by an arcade composed of three rounded pillars of a Norman type, supporting pointed arches. It is perhaps of the transitional period. There is also what seems to be a Norman base to the font. The rood loft steps still remain, singularly high and narrow, and the entrance very low. A curious ornament overhead on the left hand side resembles a pastoral staff. There are two little chapels on the south side. In the eastern one a very low squint, and the eastern window is a two-light trefoil; on the northern side of the altar is a curious square pillar. On the eastern side of the door are two very small aumbreys, one perhaps used to hold the oil. A good Pembs. tower with a stair turret. Double lights near the top give light; those to the north are square-headed, to the other three points they are lancet. The stair turret is lighted by plain loops; a string course runs round the bottom of the tower.
