3642 Church St. Issell's 85 No. 4 Apparently a comparatively late church, perhaps of Tudor date. A very handsome tower with stair turret. The tower is lighted near the top by four rather flat double-lancet lights; a Tudor double light near the bottom to the west. In order to accommodate the building to the ground, a flight of steps gives entrance to the body of the church from the west door, under thw tower. There are two colonnades that to the south a restoration. The pointed arches are supported on octagonal pillars; that giving light to the chancel is a very glat late arch. The font appears old - a square oolite basin with somewhat archaic scroll decorations on a still older limestone base. Observe the transposed head on the south-east angle. The steps of the church yard cross remain on the northern side of the building. TCASPC Od. 11 rebuilt, except tower in 1864, nuclely Socket of cross in Church yourd cut stoup forms
