There is a little more disturbance to the rampart - widening the gap at the southern end. The rampart is incorporated into a hedgebank which is now much overgrown. The ditch is well preserved though a little dumping of rubble has occurred just north of the gap at the southern end.

There appears to be a second defensive bank to the east of the rampart - as shown in sketch. It is constructed from earth and has traces of a ditch at the southern end. The low bank is now covered in pasture although from the 1955 Mendip APs it can be seen that the bank was covered by a hedgebank. At this stage it is impossible to say if the bank was solely a hedgebank or if it did comprise part of the defences.

The height of the bank was approx. 1.7m.
