Hospitium of St. John Baptist Tenby 100A No. 16 Hospital or Free Chapel was founded by William de Valence and his Countess Joan - Fenton 430. According to George Owen, Robert Collins was last master. In "Surveys of Wales" we find an indenture dated XIX, Henry VIII (1527) in which Robert Collins is described as Vicar of Tenby, and another in XXX, Henry VIII (1598) in which he still holds the same office. In the lease granted by Elizabeth to the Corporation of Tenby, the late Vicar, Thomas (alias Robert Collins) is mentioned. Finally the greater part of the lands belong ing to St. John's Hospital were let on lease to Robert and Agnes Collins, presumably the wife, who eventually took up her abode in Serjeant's Lane, Tenby. Next to the Collins family the Records had St. John's and resided there for several generations, producing good men from their stock. (See Little England, 208) Norris figured the Mansion House, of which now not one stone remains.
