The well mentioned by Leland. (See Little England, 260). In the Burgage Rent Rolls it is called the WINEPIT, WYMPIT, and WHITEPIT. Norris figured it in a ruinous condition. See phillipps' Collection in Cardiff; Norris' Views, 15019, 53.

The site of the well is marked by a B.S.A.H.I.  
plaque set in the garden wall to  
Langstone. Inscribed: UNDER  
THIS STONE / IS / ST JOHN'S WELL / FOR /  
MANY CENTURIES / THE / SOLE WATER  
SUPPLY / OF THE / INHABITANTS OF  
TENBY "
