Not far from Lydstep are the ruins at **Whitewell (37)**. Closer to Tenby lie
the ruins of **Scotsborough (10)**, a late medieval mansion of some substance
and once a Perrot family home. It is intriguing that the Royal Commissioners
wrote in 1915: "Of this 16th Century house hardly one stone remains above

another". One suspects they did not walk the full distance up the path to the
ruined house as even today it is quite substantial and well worth a visit! Again, it
is surprising that such a considerable ruin should have lain so peacefully for so
many years on the edge of a popular tourist resort without attracting more notice.
