Churchyard

Buried Cross

There is a report, which is very circumstantial, that one of the Tudors of Tenby, buried a sculptured cross in the churchyard, as although it savoured of Popery, he did not think it right to destroy the emblem of salvation. The cross originally stood near Jameston. It is said to have been buried about fifty years ago.
