The parish church of St. Edren's; dedicated to St. Edeyrn who is said to have been the son of Vortimore. There are here four crosses – two bearing Hiberno-Saxon miniscules, and two plain incised crosses. See Arch. Camb. 1896, p. 293. Mr. Henry Owen F.S.A. in Pembroke County Guardian, Jan. 25, 1896, days: "There is a legend that the grass in the churchyard of St. Edren is a certain cure for hydrophobia in man and beast."
