

Elevation to the High St built 1829 and heightened 1860. 2 storeys; upper storey of stucco of 1860, lower of stone of 1829. Upper storey with cornice & parapet, inscription "Town Hall 1860" in parapet above centre bay. Lower storey with three round-arched doorways with openwork cast-iron fanlights; a pair of iron gates or wood doors in each opening; centre opening projects forward, and in the tympanum of the pediment above there is a carving of a heraldic device used on the Borough Seal. Behind the entrance facade are market stalls and, towards the N. end, a staircase with iron balustrade & arrow-headed finials connects the ground floor with the Court Room or Old Town Hall above. Behind the Court Room is the main hall of the Market, a glass-roofed structure erected in 1890.

Rear wall has its facade to Upper Hog St. Stone end & centre bays which project & in centre of each bay is a round-headed doorway with impost bands & cast iron fanlights. Thin ashlar band and capping & dressed stone plinth which continue across the two wider intervening wall spaces which have plastered surfaces.
