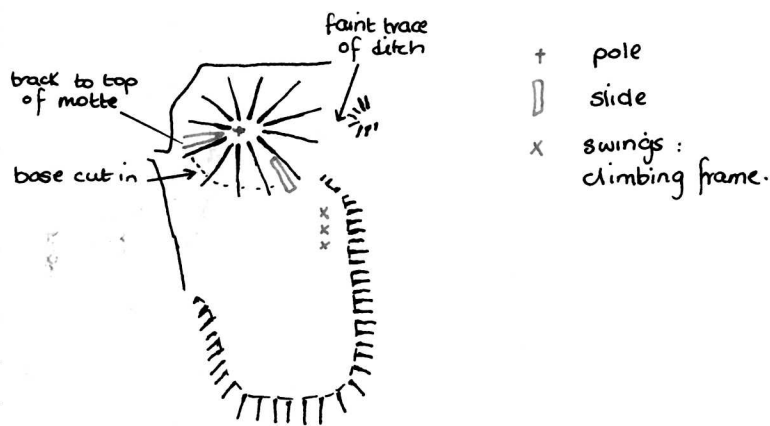

St Clears Castle is a good example of a Motte and Bailey. The motte is c10m high and covered over with long grass, also bracken and blackthorn on the N West and North sides. There is a children's slide on the S East side and a well worn track leading up to it. There is another track to the top of the mound on the West side. The base has been slightly cut into on the S West and South sides.

Slight trace of a ditch on the East side and beyond it a small mound 1.75m high.

The bailey is indicated by the level area to the south which has been extended by tipping. A grassed area used as a children's playground with some swings and a climbing frame on the N East side.
