

Rebuilt 1770, on site of earlier church.
Font belongs to earlier structure.


ST. MARY'S and ST CURIG'S church,
built in 1770, upon the site of an
earlier church, now disused and
in a ruinous state. Just the shell
of the church now survives, consisting of
a Nave & chancel, with a doorway in
the west side, 4 windows (without
the glass) and a small blocked up
square window.

An arch separates the chancel from
the nave, the roof is destroyed, apart
from the area above the chancel.

The church has a bellcote, in the west
end of the Nave, above the west doorway.
It is leaning at a dangerous angle,
no bell now remains.

The church is surrounded by a low
churchyard wall, and only has 1
gravestone now remaining, with this
dating from the year 1787. The
Furnishings from the church were moved
to St Guinio's church, Harwinia, P.R.N
17353. These consist of the old altar
& wooden cross, the top half of a
possible monumental slab, and the bowl
of the old font, which stands outside
St. Guinio's
