Church Ways

Very Large Tumulus 542-3

This tump contains hundreds of skeletons. They are in three layers, men, women and children, orientated. They were not coffined, but each grave was marked out with water-worn stones. With these bodies were two bronze rings, one a fine piece of apparently ancient manufacture, the other thin and modern looking. In the centre of the tump was a primary interment in a cistvaen; the bones had perished. In this grave was the stone socket on which a door had turned, which had been used on both sides; also a slab of limestone, roughly inscribed with a cross within a circle. All these things are in the Tenby Museum. Little England, 57.
