
Old Vicarage

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The late Professor Freeman point this ~~castle~~^{building} out as "a very remarkable fragment". A series of arches forming two arcades should be noted. There is also a fine mantelpiece. Arch. Camb. II, iii, 200.

Across the bay, to the east, lies **Eastington (3)** another small-scale but emphatically fortified building, once a home of the celebrated Perrott family, now an adjunct to a long, handsome 18th century farmhouse. Close by, are two early gate-posts. It is sad that such a good group of buildings should lie in close proximity to the perimeter fence of the Texaco Refinery. Nearby Rhoscrowther Church is also well worth a visit.

When in Castlemartin, the cottage-like ruin at the top of the Churchyard which is called speculatively **The Old Vicarage (41)** is worth exploring for its strange internal stone arches.
