


Restored @th (Considerably)

The Parish Church was built in the
14th c. In 1867 it was in a deplorable
state without roof, doors, windows
or pews. It was re-opened in 1870.

It is cruciform in plan with a
nave, chancel, shallow north + south
aisles, a chancel chapel, west and
south porches and a triple bellcote
on the west end which was
rebuilt in 1872 as a triple rather
than a single bellcote. The windows
are modern with the exception of a
tall single light with trefoiled
head in the east wall of the south
aisle chapel which may be 14th c.
