great part of it being paved. The
roof of the west end wants mending.
Lying at the west end over the porch and
about the church in other places should
be destroyed'

'The church is a neat, plain, building
consisting of two aisles, without either
tower or steeple, having a small belfry
placed over the west end for the reception
of two bells. It is divided internally by a
range of pointed arches and massive
octagonal columns'
