

This chapel was noted on Rees map of the 14th c.^① By the time when the Decabar Stone PRN 1778 was rediscovered in 1828 the chapel was in ruins^② and Lewis in 1844^③ also records that the chapel had "been entirely demolished". Jones^② seems to be slightly confused and refers to the field visit of Glynn^④ to Llangeler Church c. 1850. This visit however was to Llangeler parish church PRN 5263 not to Capel mai. ~~This may be the~~ He also records^③ that this chapel was restored in the early 19th c perhaps to fit in with Glynn's visit^④. It was used as a school following the building of a new chapel in 1898 PRN 22262^②. Is this the same school as PRN 16642. There is nothing to suggest that it was originally a Mediaeval chapel.
