## AUTHORITY

This chapel was noted on Rees map of the 14th c.<sup>①</sup> By the time when the Decabar Stone PRN 1778 was rediscovered in 1828 the Chapel was in ruins<sup>②</sup> and Lewis in 1844<sup>③</sup> also records that the Chapel had "been entirely demolished". Jones<sup>②</sup> seems to be slightly confused and refers to the field visit of Glynne<sup>④</sup> to Llangeler Church c. 1850. This visit however was to Llangeler Parish church PRN 5263 not to Chapel Mai. ~~This may be the~~  
 He also records<sup>③</sup> that this Chapel was restored in the early 19th c perhaps to fit in with Glynne's visit<sup>④</sup>. It was used as a school following the building of a new Chapel in 1898 PRN 22262<sup>②</sup>? Is this the same school as PRN 16642. There is nothing to suggest that it was originally a medieval Chapel.
