

2. Banc y Geulron (fig. 4: surveyed 1977) SN 77 SW

Standing on a low eminence within an open hollow at c. 305 m OD, adjacent to a track. The cairn consists of an oval grass-grown mound of earth and stones measuring 14.5 m (E-W) × 11.5 m with a maximum height of 1 m. A discontinuous ring of spaced orthostats protrudes from the surface of the cairn and has a diameter of 7.5 m. The most massive orthostat, conspicuous by its size, is situated on the SW. Although 12 uprights were recorded by Sansbury (1932: 19), only 11 are now visible. In a hollow at the centre of the mound are two more orthostatic slabs which are probably the remains of a cist.
