

## 14. D. K. Leighton. STRUCTURED ROUND CAIRNS

25. Lle'r Neuaddau (fig 12, surveyed 1977) SS 78 SE

7555 8465

Located at c. 320 m OD on a shelf on high ground above the confluence of the Afon Rheidol and one of its tributaries. The site comprises a circle of upright and leaning blocks and slabs surrounding a level turf-covered interior. The circle, which has a diameter of 7 m consists of 18 orthostats, though 19 were recorded in 1932 (Sansbury 1932, 34). A loose slab on the N perimeter is probably a former upright and a hollow on the SE the site of another. None rise to more than 0.7 m above the turf. The interior of the circle is now only a few centimetres above the exterior. In the SW sector there is a large hollow measuring approximately 1.75 m x 1 m and 0.35 m deep, at the E end of which is an orthostat. This is presumably the remains of a cist. According to Griffiths (RCAHMW Record MS) this pit was lined with stones in 1953 though appeared possibly to have been excavated.
