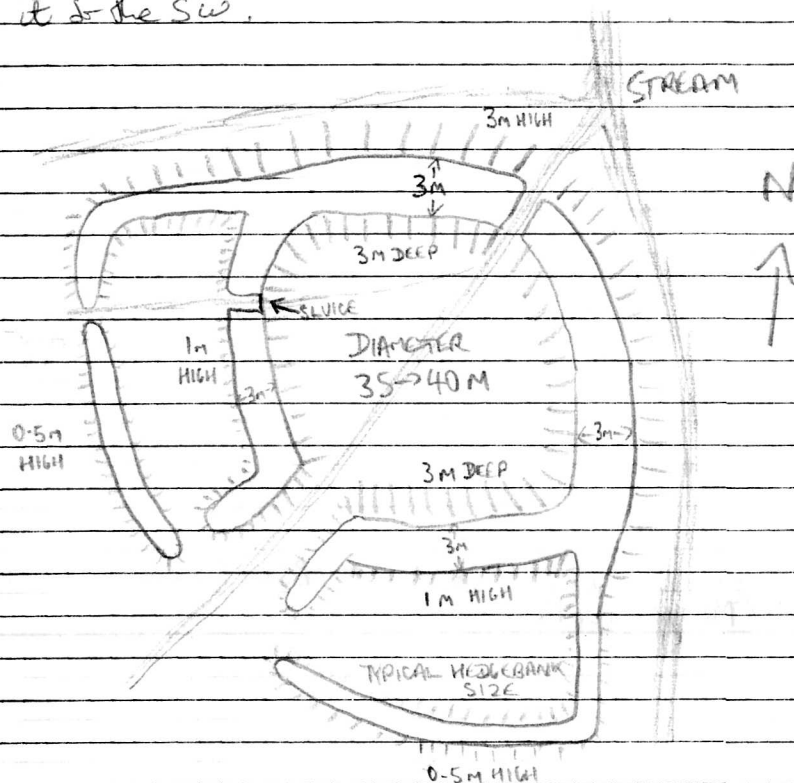


Pattern formed by hedge banks.

THE INNER CIRCUIT OF BANKS ARE CONSIDERABLY
MORE MASSIVE THAN HEDGE BANKS IN THE
AREA WHEREAS THE 2 OTHER CONCENTRIC
BOUNDARIES ARE TYPICAL. THE INTERPRETATION
OF THE SITE AS A POND ARISES FROM
THE FACT THAT THE AREA ENCLOSED BY
THE INNER CIRCUIT IS SO DEEP. THERE IS ALSO
A SWICE CUT INTO ONE SIDE OF THE INNER
ENCLOSURE. HOWEVER IF THE SITE IS A POND
I CAN'T SEE THE SENSE OF THE 2 OUTER
CIRCULAR HEDGE BANKS. PERHAPS THE
WHOLE SITE IS A LATER ADAPTATION OF AN
EARLIER FARTHWORX, AND USED BY A SMITHY
KNOWN TO HAVE WORKED NEAR THIS AREA. (KILBY 1917)
