Hut circles, spindle whorls, flint flakes, and foundations. Stackpole sand dunes were thickly inhabited during the Neolithic and Bronze Ages, and from the occurrence of iron slag on the Burrows it would seem that they retained their population into the Iron Period. Fishing in the sheltered fiords, now converted into ponds, was probably the cause of this settlement.
