Chapel of ease to Hanartney Church. It is a well chapel dating to the 14th c and the holy water was apparently a cure for spasm sufferers. The front wall (west) has a plain pointed door and above is a single trifoliated lancet window	J Jenkins 1939
The chapel is built of well dressed limestone, the front west wall still stands to its full height and the doorway, window and bellcote are still in place. A lot of building rubble was piled up outside the front of the church. It was difficult to tell exactly where it came from, probably the ruined cottage adjacent to the chapel.
