Flimston

Well to the east and also on the Range (but more accessible due to the proximity of a chapel) lies **Flimston (11)**, another sprawling complex of buildings of various dates, the earliest part being a typical South Pembrokeshire hall house with a round stone chimney and a vaulted cellar or undercroft. This section is incorporated at the northern end of a rambling structure which was occupied as a farmhouse and together with its adjacent (and later) outbuildings must have been an imposing sight in its heyday. It was abandoned upon the setting up of the Range.
