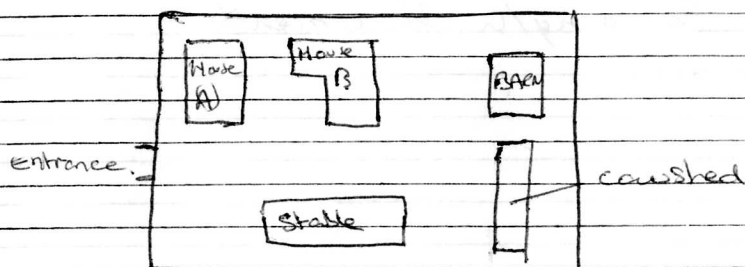


2 houses - one 1742, other 1773, from part of  
a farm layout  
Barn - dated 17-- , byre dated 1759.

There are two houses, the one  
(A) nearest the entrance was built  
in 1773, and is still in a good  
state of repair.



Mr Davies said that there is a kiln  
inside for drying the corn.

The other house (B) was built in  
1743 and is lived in now, it has  
a large fireplace and chimney stack.

The barn was built in 1776, and  
the stable, which is now used as  
a coachhouse, was built in 1758.

Mr Davies did not know when the

all these buildings are in a good  
condition.

The farm was once part of an  
estate owned by Philip Lloyd, and  
its history may be found in a book  
by Thomas Lloyd.
