

Remains of chapel wall visible at NW end of field? No other features visible.

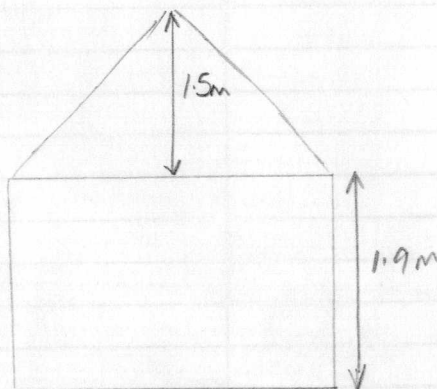
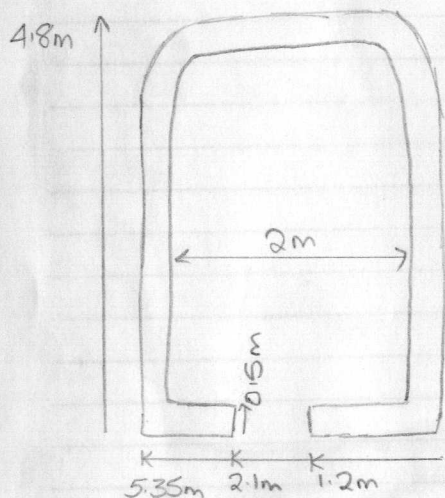

The stone foundations mentioned above are the remains of a hedge-line. There is no evidence of the existence of a chapel in the main field but the orchard has a small, single-storey building in the SW corner.
