This must have been the place where Col. Rowland Laugharne accompanied by seven troopers routed and took prisoners 20 Royalists including the Lieutenant. "This success was the more remarkable because it was achieved between two garrisons of the enemy not much more distant from each other than musket shot" one garrison being in Carew Castle, the other apparently in the old Rectory.
