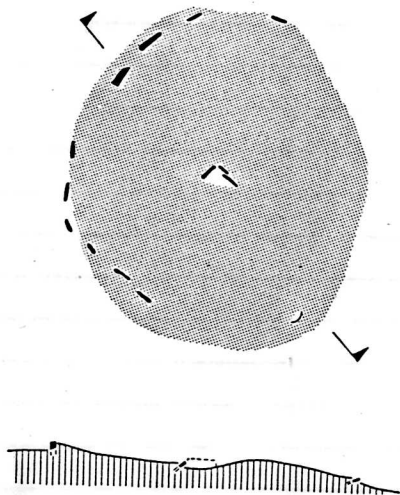


28. Moelau (fig B: surveyed 1977) 88 75 NW 7396 5954
 Situated at 434 m OD in a slight saddle on a spur projecting from the N side of the Groes Fawr Valley, close to the junction of two streams. It lies to the NE of a *hafod* complex at this junction and which is marked on the OS 6" sheet (1963 edition). The cairn consists of a fairly consolidated, though badly disturbed, oval mound of stones and small boulders and measures 11 m N 80° E to m. Close to the perimeter of the cairn, on its W side, is an arc of upright slabs none protruding more than a few centimetres above the cairn. A further leaning slab lies on the SE. The arrangement of these stones suggests there was formerly an orthostatic circle of diameter c. 10 m. At the centre of the cairn lies an open cist. The capstone is probably the slab which lies on the SE of the cairn to the NE.
