

17. Cefn-cerrig (fig. 9; surveyed 1980) SN 75 NE

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On the nose of a ridge at c. 442 m OD, the ground falling away steeply to the NW and SE. The cairn is an unconsolidated mass of stones and boulders and measures 21 m (NW-SE)  $\times$  18 m with a maximum height of 0.5 m. The oval shape is probably due to part of the cairn mass slipping down the sides of the ridge. Projecting through the cairn, and close to its perimeter, is a discontinuous ring of upright and leaning slabs none rising to more than a few centimetres above the cairn. The ring is most evident on the S where the slabs are largest and where a number of them are contiguous. On the N cairn material has been gathered up along a 'corridor' and a shooting box built near the centre of the mound. Despite this disturbance there is no evidence of a cist.

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
