

The site, as marked on DAT record map^① from TAT AP's ② which is not at present available, lies in a field called Park Bannal on Castle Lloyd Farm ③

① SN20 NW; 1:10,000; 1975

② TAT AP SN2408; 1979; Oblique AP

③ Tithe Map + apptt, Laugharne Ph 1841, TS No. 754 in NW

It lies in the saddle of a south facing promontory looking out over Pendine Sands. It is circular and is centred on the 115m contour line.

The hedges have been removed and the whole of the area east of the track is regularly ploughed for corn. Mr. Owen has noticed

differential growth in these fields but not in any pattern. He

attributes it to thin soil in these fields. The corn is only just

sprouting, no differential growth was noticed, neither were there any surface indications of antiquity.

Sherds of post Medieval green-glaze ware were observed ~~at the~~ and of more modern ware.
