

5. Blaen Breli 2 (fig. 6; surveyed 1981) SN 75 NW

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Lying at 375 m OD close to the Afon Breli on ground falling away steeply to the SE towards the river. The cairn survives as a low, oval, mound of mixed grade stones consolidated on the uphill side but rather loose on the downhill side. It measures 12.2 m (N-S) \times 10.5 m. The downhill side of the mound appears to have been reveted by a number of orthostatic slabs. Additional revetment is suggested by the existence of four prostrate slabs protruding from the cairn further downhill. Towards the centre of the cairn is a small, partly exposed, cist. The cairn has probably been denuded by quarrying in view of the close proximity of a number of ruined drystone buildings.
