The churchyard is entered by a lych-gate which is an old one. It is a very rough affair and sadly in need of repair. By the side of the gate is a building used as a stable and cottage. This is comparatively modern, but has been erected on an old foundation, the stones of the latter being very large. For a description of the church of St. Tyssilio, and of the registers, see Arch. Camb. V, xv, 242. The church was restored in 1838 and repaired in 1874. In the possession of the vicar is an old register, or rather diary, in which an 18th century vicar recorded his work and sentiments. Dr. H. Owen has had this book re-bound.

Pemb Arch Survey

St. Tyssilio's church, built upon the foundation's of a earlier church. Consists of a nave & chancel, with a Arch separating the two. 12 coloured glass windows, wooden pews & wooden tiled floors, and has a South doorway & Porch. It has a Font in the western end of the nave, and the base of a late Norman type outside the SW corner of the church or the South Porch. A possible baptistry? can also be seen SW of the church. Four inscribed stones, ~~to~~ have been incorporated into the exterior Southern wall of the nave.

Lych gate with 2 stone blocks built into it, with 2 inscriptions, 1 dated 1699, the other 1897.
